the “Certificate of Health Examination (健康診断証明書)” (AY 2026)

Reports and Certificates for those who took the General Student Health Examination
at the designated off-campus location will be issued **starting in July**.

	Medical Examination Report (健康診断書)	Certificate of Health Examination (健康診断証明書)
Eligible recipients	Students who completed ALL ITEMS* of the General Student Health Examination (April 2026 to May 29, 2026) *Internal medicine (including simple hearing test), chest X-ray, blood pressure measurement, urinalysis (protein, glucose, occult blood), vision test, height and weight. *Certificates for those requiring re-examination will be issued at a later date.	
What is the difference between the two documents?	<u>Both contain the results of the AY2026 General Student Health Examination.</u> The Medical Examination Report is certified by a school doctor. If the submitting institution requires a specific certificate format, please notify us. Otherwise, it will be issued in HU's standard format.	
Where can it be issued?	<u>HU Health Care Center</u> Consultation hours: 13:30–15:30 (Mon–Fri, excluding national holidays) • The certificate will be issued after the medical examination. • For closure dates, please check the following website. https://www.hokudai.ac.jp/hoken/ 	<u>ACM (Automated Certificate Machine)</u> ACM units are installed at 8 locations on campus, including the Hakodate Campus. About Additional Screening Items	You may request additional health examination only for those specifically designated by off-campus organizations in connection with job hunting, internships, or other activities required for your studies. Please bring the document listing the screening items during the consultation hours of HU Health Care Center. Available Tests: (1) Color vision (Ishihara test), waist circumference, chest circumference, grip strength (2) Urine sediment (including qualitative urine analysis), electrocardiogram (at rest), pulmonary function test (3) General peripheral blood tests (red blood cell count, white blood cell count, platelet count, hemoglobin level, hematocrit value, white blood cell differential) . Note: For any tests other than those listed above, you must take them at another medical facility (at your own expense) and bring the results with you to have them recorded. If you have not take (all or part of) the general student health checkup, a certificate cannot be issued.
