

Ehime University



- Six-University Coordination Service Learning Program at the Rural Communities in Japan and Indonesia (SUIJI)
 - Sponsored by MEXT (2012), “Re-Inventing Japan Project” Type I
 - 3 universities in Japan and 3 universities in Indonesia
 - Students (undergraduate) visit rural areas to develop “glocal” mind to become “servant leaders”
 - Japanese students visit Indonesian villages for 2 weeks, while Indonesian students visit Japanese villages for 2 weeks
 - Those students are expected to contribute to sustainable future community by supporting rural areas
 - The SUIJI also has a Master’s/Doctoral program



Sophia University

- Over 250 partner institutions in 50 countries
- 10% of students are international students
 - 66% of international students are from 19 Asian countries (13 Indonesian students)
- Offer English-Based programs
 - E.g., Undergraduate
 - Faculty of Liberal Arts
 - Faculty of Science & Technology
 - Green Science
 - Green Engineering
- 4 partner institutions in Indonesia
- ASEAN International Mobility for Students (AIMS)
- Student mobility programs through worldwide Christian network



Tadulako University



- 29,495 students and 1,650 faculty staffs
- 4 research centers (e.g., environmental) and 10 faculties (e.g., Faculty of Education and Teachers Training, Faculty of Medical and Health Science)
- Partner universities in Japan
 - Toyohashi University of Technology
 - Joint seminars, joint publication, student exchange, internship program
 - Kyoto Prefecture University
 - Joint research on plant biology
 - Joint seminars, joint publication
 - Toyama Prefecture University, Shiga Prefecture University
 - Joint seminars, joint publication

Tokyo University of Foreign Studies




- Education and research of foreign languages and area studies
 - School of Language and Culture Studies: 27 language majors (including Indonesian)
 - School of International and Area Studies: 14 region majors
- 152 partner institutions and 3 consortia with 58 countries
- Peace and Conflict Studies (PCS)
 - International and interdisciplinary research and study program conducted completely in English since 2004
 - Master's Program and Doctoral Program, PCS Global Campus Program
 - PCS Global Campus Program
 - Online lecture among member universities from 8 countries (including Indonesia)

UIN Sunan Ampel Surabaya

- Mission
 - To provide a high quality education on multidisciplinary Islamic studies, science and technology
 - To conduct research on Islamic studies, science and technology that is relevant with demands of communities
 - To develop a religious model of research-based community engagement
- 9 faculties, 42 undergraduate programs, 12 graduate programs
- Community Engaged University (CEU)
 - The university is a partner of community for empowerment
 - Community Engagement is an integral part of learning and research



University of Tsukuba



- Core institution of Tsukuba, which is the largest science city in Japan
 - 32 national and 200 private research institutes
- 2,062 international students (121 from Indonesia) from 104 countries
- 13 overseas offices in 12 countries
- Innovative educational and research systems
 - Campus in Campus
 - Set up a virtual campus in each other's campus
 - Juke Box System
 - Students can choose courses also from other universities as if they choose music from a juke box



University of Indonesia

- Internationally recognized university
- 3,000 faculty members, 45,000 students
- Collaboration with Japanese universities
 - MOUs with 100 Japanese universities
 - Student exchange: 22 universities
 - Double or joint degree: 7 universities
 - Research and community service: 10 universities
- Keen in developing more collaborations in research and double/joint degree in
 - Information & communication technology, poverty alleviation and community, energy, and others

Tsukuba's Juke Box System

- What is the Juke Box System?
 - List courses of other universities as well so that students can choose courses that best fit their needs
- What are the benefits?
 - Students can easily transfer the credits of courses that they had taken abroad
 - Large variety of courses can be offered
 - Juke Box system benefits students especially when different universities offer complementary courses
- Some courses utilize e-learning and tele-conference for taking remotely-offered courses
- Wish list #1
 - Many universities participate in this so that students have huge course options

Double/Joint degree programs

- Some Indonesian universities are keen in expanding double/joint degree programs with Japanese universities
- Barriers especially on the Japanese side
 - Language
 - Insufficient understanding of contents of courses offered by partner universities
 - Administrative burden especially for joint degree programs
