JOINT WORKING GROUP OF INDONESIA AND JAPAN UNIVERSITIES
SURABAYA 25 OCTOBER 2017

3. Industry and University Collaboration in Innovation

ATTACHMENT 3. RESEARCH AND INNOVATION COLLABORATION

Indonesia and Japan Universities attended the JWG 2017 agree to achieve the below goals for collaboration in research and innovation collaboration:

1. Establishing a stronger bridge between Japan universities and Indonesia universities (the universities which have more researches will collaborate with universities which have less research)
2. Organizing summer research workshop
3. Coordinating research visit
